GOAL:

To understand and practice 2020 abundant Kingdom vision as we gather for God's glory.

GET GOING:

- As Highpoint celebrates 20 years of God's faithfulness, what is one story or future ministry that most encourages you? If future ministry, what do you think is your specific role in seeing that ministry accomplished (Heb. 10:24-25)?
- Describe the last time you experienced or witnessed community (inside or outside the church) at its best. What happened? Who was there? Why did it feel like community at its best?

MEMORY VERSE

*"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."
(Heb 10:24-25).*



KEEP GROWING:

- Based on this weekend, how would you distinguish between biblical community and community in general?
- In what ways does Acts 2:42-47 further display the early church's commitment to gather together frequently and faithfully to exhort, encourage, enlighten, and engage each other as our stories bring God glory? In what ways can we apply Acts 2:42-47 to 2020?
- Read Hebrews 10:19-25. In what ways do the 3 (three) "let us" statements build on top of each other? Why is the order of the three "let us" statements important?
- How have you been personally exhorted, encouraged, enlightened and engaged by a community to use your story to bring God glory? What are the key principles that need to be multiplied from your story?
- Hebrews 10:24-25 calls Christians to consider (literally, specific and precise consideration) and stir up (literally, spurring on encouragement) one another towards love and good works. What is one specific way that you might "spur on encouragement" to one believer and one unchurched person this week?

BONUS CHALLENGE

Read Philippians 1:6. In what area of your life is this truth the hardest for you to believe? On your own or with someone else, consider writing/sharing in which area of your life this is hardest to believe.
