GOAL:

 - ... I care tangibly (Acts 11:27-30)

BONUS THOUGHT: “And in Antioch the disciples were first called Christians” (Acts 11:26).



KEEP GROWING:

- As Christians, we're blessed to be included in the expansion of God's Kingdom. Take a minute to read these other passages in Acts on why we share our faith boldly. Write down a few observations from these passages and discuss how you can practically apply these truths to your life today.
 - **Acts 2:41** - People want it
 - **Acts 2:47** - People need it
 - **Acts 4:4** - People are changed by it
 - **Acts 6:7** - People are matured by it
 - **Acts 8:12** - People will be blessed by it
 - **Acts 9:42** - God's Kingdom becomes known through it
