


THE MARRIAGE TRIANGLE




Who is at the top of your marriage?

Too often we place ourselves at the top. Or we place our spouse at the top. Sometimes we place our kids or our career at the top.




Pastor Ron says, "a good thing becomes a bad thing when it crowds out the best thing." Idolatry is when we place someone or something ahead of God.

Who or what is at the top of your marriage triangle? This next triangle shows God at the top of the marriage - with the husband and wife at the bottom corners of the triangle.



When a couple commits to prioritizing worship, reading the Bible, praying with each other, and engaging in biblical community, the couple grows spiritually - individually and as a couple.

In doing so, they not only grow closer to God, they grow closer to each other.



When a husband and wife move vertically up the sides of the triangle, they also grow closer to one another and distance between them gets smaller. The more each grows in the Lord, the closer the marriage becomes.
