• What is the longest you have ever had to wait for something?

Study: Go Deeper

Read Hebrews 6:13-20, what insights or principles stood out to you as you studied the passage and heard it preached this week?

God is Faithful: Wait for His Timing! (13a, 14-15)

- In verses 13-15, the writer recalls God's promise to Abraham.
 What stands out to you about how long Abraham waited and why he trusted God during that time?
- Can you recall a time when God's promises felt delayed, but later you saw His faithfulness? What did you learn through that waiting?

God is Trustworthy: Walk in His Truth! (13b, 16-18)

- What does this passage teach us about the nature of God's promises and His character? (vv. 16-18)
- The author says it's "impossible for God to lie." Why is that truth so foundational to our faith?
- What do you think the two "unchangeable things" (v.18) refer to, and how do they strengthen our confidence in God?
- How does remembering that "it is impossible for God to lie" affect the way you approach worry, fear, or disappointment?
- Finish this statement: "Because God cannot lie, I can trust Him with _____."

God is Unfailing: Worship His Son! (19-20)

- Verse 19 calls our hope "an anchor for the soul." What do you think that metaphor communicates about the role of hope in a believer's life?
- What is meant by Jesus being our "forerunner" who entered the inner place behind the curtain (v.20)? How does this connect to the larger message of Hebrews?
- What are some "anchors" people tend to rely on in our culture instead of Christ? Why do they ultimately fail?
- If Jesus is our "forerunner," paving the way to God's presence, what does that mean for how we approach Him in prayer and worship today?
